- Supporting the artist with any prep work prior to the workshop (dates/times can be agreed between the volunteer and studio artist).

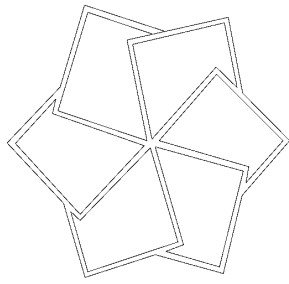
