The volunteers would be required from 1pm – 5pm to set up, clean up and deliver the workshops.

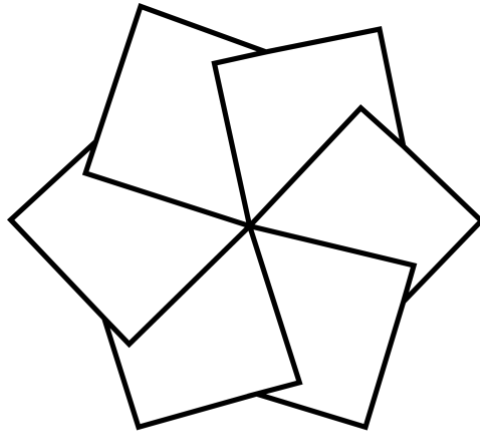
2 Project meetings must be attended in June in the run up to the project for anyone assisting. **Please note that these dates / times are TBC.**

This opportunity is suitable for volunteers who have an interest in developing a socially engaged arts practice, or who have an interest in community and learning projects.

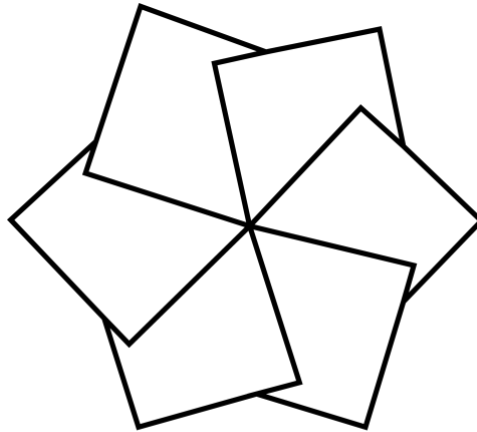

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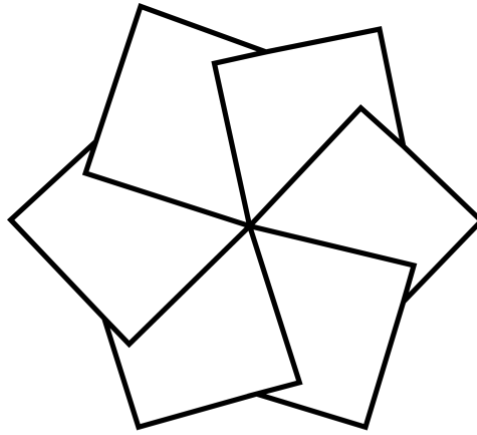
